This **\*HU** - ONLINE Coach 1/Coach 2 course must be completed prior to registering for any stand-alone **\*Coach 1** - Intro to Coach clinic. Failure to complete the **\*HU** - ONLINE Coach 1/Coach 2 course prior will NOT allow you to register for this clinic.

## Coaching - Additional Requirements (1 of 2)

#### HU Safety Trainer / Safety - \*HU - ONLINE Safety

This four hour online program is an introduction to team safety, injury recognition, fair play code and code of ethics, safety at the rink, injury management and the Emergency Action Plan. The team's Safety Person receives the information and confidence needed to be the go-to person on your team for health, wellness, injury recognition safe and proper recovery, and Return to Play procedures.

This training is **valid for three seasons** from the date of completion (expiring on September 1). Once expired, one must re-take the online course.

## **On-Ice Volunteers**

#### **On-Ice Volunteer**

- Someone who only assists on-ice during practices.
- **Require all the same qualifications** as any other coach on the team.
- It is recommended to list them as an **assistant coach** in case they are required on the bench at some time.

#### **On-Ice Helper**

- Policy
- **Registered players** that help with younger age groups on the ice.
- Not required to be on the team list of the team they help out with.
- Not permitted on the bench during games.

## Dressing Room Chaperone Requirements (1 of 2)

Also known as Parent Helper.

Listed on the official team roster and is used for assistance with the Two Deep/Rule of 2 Policy in the dressing room before and after games.

## Dressing Room Chaperones (2 of 2)

#### Female Dressing Room Chaperones as per <u>Policy #16.0 - Dressing Room Supervision</u>

Supervise players in the dressing room as outlined by Hockey Canada.

"A lone personnel member should never be in the dressing room with players at any time, especially when players are showering or changing: two adults should be present together, this is called the "Two Deep Method" of supervision. Supervising personnel must be members of the team staff or adults who have completed either "Speak Out" or the "Respect In Sport" for volunteers and have submitted their record checks (CRC] to their MHA. Parents of all players should be made aware of the "Two Deep Method" and avoid letting their children into unsupervised dressing rooms."

#### No photos in the Dressing Room as per Team Rule #1 in Policy #14.0 - Social Media Policy

Under no circumstances is picture taking within the dressing room permitted at any time. Failure to comply with this policy could result in the offenders' expulsion from MEIFHA.

**NOTE:** Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC) not required for Safety Reps **UNLESS you will also be a Dressing Room Chaperone**.

#### IMPORTANT



Any team staff that does not have their required certification completed by DECEMBER 1 will be automatically suspended by Hockey Nova Scotia. This means that you cannot be on the ice or fulfill your duties until all certifications are completed.

### **CRC/VSC** Requirements



All volunteers require CRC/VSC (exception is Safety Rep who requires CRC only). This is valid for 3 years expiring in August.

There are 3 ways to complete:

- 1. Submit an existing CRC/VSC completed within the last 6 months. Scan and email to risk@metroeastinferno.ca
- 2. Take the letter supplied from HNS to a RCMP detachment. Scan and email to risk@metroeastinferno.ca
- 3. Reach out to <u>risk@metroeastinfero.ca</u> and an invitation will be sent to complete online. When the VSC portion is complete select to share with MEI. **DO NOT SHARE WITH HNS DIRECTLY.**

#### Additional Notes re Requirements



- Each team will receive an **initial email by October 27th** indicating what qualifications are outstanding.
- If you receive a message from the Risk Management Coordinator that your or one of your volunteers requires a Critical Waiver Signed or Requires HC Profile Updated the volunteer will need to log into their <u>HCR account</u> to complete.
- If you have **volunteers doing 'double duty'** such as Treasurer AND Dressing Room Chaperone, please let the Registrar and Risk Management Coordinator know when submitting your roster. Their qualifications will fall under the role that requires more.
- Reminder that some requirements take time so encourage your volunteers to complete their qualifications as soon as possible.
- All teams require a Safety Rep.

## Suspensions



For a suspension during any game, contact risk@metroeastinferno.ca immediately following the game

- Include Division, Team Name, Game Time, Opposing Team and Location, (game number if you know it)
- The MEIFHA Risk Management Coordinator will then advise you about how to proceed

## Injuries and Emergencies (1 of 2)



Be aware of **emergency procedures at the home and away rinks**, keeping handy the phone numbers for ambulances and other emergency service. Your team MUST have a **first aid kit**.

Hockey Canada Emergency Action Plan

#### NCCP EAP Form

In the event that an injured players is **transported to the hospital** without the presence of his/her parent, the Manager must ensure a responsible adult accompletes the player, with the necessary <u>player medical information</u> form and an <u>injury</u> report form available for completion by the attending physician.

Ensure the <u>injury report form</u> is filled out and delivered to the Treasurer as soon as possible anytime a player/coach sustains an injury. This should be done in conjunction with the coaches as necessary.

Complete the <u>HC Team Injury Log</u>.
